Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Every once in a while, I notice something happen in my day-to-day life that is deeply profound, personal, and extraordinary. Things that amaze me and prove to me that God is actively leading my life. I like to call these things "Holy Spirit moments." I want to tell you about one of these moments that happened here at First Lutheran.

First, some context. It must have been the year 2006. I was in Denver meeting with the Rocky Mountain Synod Candidacy Committee about me attending Luther Seminary the following year. All seminary students who want to become pastors must meet with their candidacy committee regularly while they are at school to talk about how things are going and to determine whether or not the student should continue on the path to become a pastor. The day of that meeting I remember being anxious and I remember the main question they asked me. They asked, "which scripture passage guides your call to become an ordained pastor?" I thought for a moment and recalled my grandmother's favorite goodnight blessing that she would say to me at the end of the day. I responded, "Isaiah 43:4, (God said) because you are precious in my sight, and honored, and I love you." She taught me that this verse is remarkable because it is the only time in the Old Testament when God succinctly and clearly declares to the world those three simple words- I love you. I told the committee that for me, pastoral ministry is guided by God's love and honor for God's precious people. The way I understand church is that it is a community of people who are told by the pastor through preaching, sacrament, and ministry that they are precious, loved, and honored. Hearing this good news, the community embraces and lives fully into God's love which is revealed through faith, compassion and generosity to the neighbor. They liked my answer and gave permission for me to continue on the path to be a pastor.

2006 seems like an entire lifetime ago. Truth be told, before serving at First Lutheran, I was struggling with my sense of call. There had been a series of difficulties and challenges which made me wonder if I should do something else with my life instead of being a pastor. I wasn't sure if my understanding of church was accurate any more, and I was looking to God for help.

My first Sunday at First Lutheran was January 9<sup>th</sup>. That Sunday the Old Testament reading was Isaiah 43:1-7. Of all the Sundays on the calendar, that Sunday, I heard the verse that has impacted my life the most. God heard my prayer for guidance. God knew what I needed to hear and God delivered. Indeed, it was a Holy Spirit moment. I felt like God had set all God's attention on me that moment and reassured me of God's love and guidance. That day God reminded me of why I am called to be pastor. That day God reminded me of how I understood church to be in 2006 and that indeed church is still like that. That day, God reminded me of when I was a little boy seeing the smile on my grandmother's face as she played the organ at her church on Sundays. That day God declared to me again how much God loves me. And every day since then, all of you here at First Lutheran have shown me what it looks like for a community which embraces and lives fully into God's love.

Above all, I want to thank you for these past eight months. You have been a blessing to me and renewed my call to be a pastor. It has been a joy, honor and blessing to serve as your interim pastor these past eight months.

God said it first, and I feel the same way. You are precious in my sight, and honored, and I love you.
