Lately, I've been reading the book of Job while I ponder the joys as well as the struggles of various people in my life. "What is God up to?" This is the question I keep asking when I hear about people suffering. To aid my understanding of suffering I decided to read the book of Job these few weeks. Do you ask this same or similar question of, "what is God doing?" If so, I invite you with me to learn from Job's faith journey.

I found the last chapter of Job to be very insightful. Job 42:1-6

"Then Job answered the Lord: I know that you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted. You asked, 'Who is this that hides counsel without knowledge?' Therefore, I have uttered what I did not understand, things too wonderful for me, which I did not know. You said, 'listen now, and I will speak; I will question you, and you will answer me.' I had heard of you by the hearing of the ear, but now my eyes see you; therefore, I despise myself, and repent in dust and ashes"

Job is often lifted up as a man of great faith. An example to emulate, and he was. Afterall, everything was taken from him. He lost relationships, his family, his wealth, and his health. Yet, through all Job's suffering he remained faithful to God. Reading this book, I see that Job's story isn't simply about a man with strong faith, but it is about a man who grows in faith. His faith evolves through his hardship. He is humbled and realizes that he has a lot to learn about who God is and what it means to be faithful. Wrapping up Job's story, Chapter 42 shows us that Job learns the value and importance of listening to God. Listening to God through the sights and sounds of the world around us. Myself, and I think many people of faith, are comfortable speaking about God and even speaking to God. I speak out-loud the words, "God, what are you doing?" I let the wind carry away the words while I wait for God's response. As is often the case, when I don't receive an immediate response, I ask again- maybe louder this time. I don't realize that the louder I become, the harder it becomes to listen. Reading Job, I see the wisdom and necessity of closing my mouth and listening to God. Over the course of Job's story, he learns to be quiet and pay attention to the goodness of God, to the unfathomable greatness of God's power, and to the majestic creativity of God that is evident all around us. I hope for all of us to follow Job's understanding and humility. The more we pay attention to what God has done and is doing all around us the quieter we become. Presented with the immeasurable display of God's might and God's careful attention to the smallest detail of creation we find ourselves silenced in awe. I think it is within the moments of silenced awe when God reveals what God is up to. My prayer today is for God to grant us a quiet summer of learning and growing. To be good listeners and experience the great and wonderful things that we might have missed otherwise.





Property Committee Report: Rian is looking for a painter and contractor for the offices—Going to Yoder for kitchenette. Dan Wherland was suggested as a painter. It was voted on for a budget of \$5,000 for kitchenette remodel, Mary M. motioned and Dave P. seconded. The side door to the church is now fixed. Landscaping in front of the church-Rian is in contact with the guys that did our lawncare last year to see if they can remove the dead bushes and replace them. Cathy Koland planted flowers in the front of the church but is unable to maintain their care. Rian will water or find someone who can.

New Business: Copier leas is almost up and there is a quote from Metro on a new copier with the ability to fold booklets. Ben found a way to save money on our service contract and the new copier will be more efficient with ink so it brings the price down about \$60 per month. Connie motioned to approve new copier and contract. Mary seconded. Garage sale date and times set. Proceeds going to purchase a new dishwasher for the kitchen. Need volunteers to set up and price. July 10th after meeting will start bringing stuff upstairs and moving tables and chairs from fellowship hall. Confirmation kids to count toward service hours?

Letter to be sent out to congregation for announcement of Candidate of Choice and date for the congregational vote. Pastor Erik will announce the meeting on Sundays. Meet and greet to be sent out in letter.
