First Lutheran Church – Hibbing is a parish of the Northeastern Minnesota Synod, one of 65 synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The ELCA is one of the largest Christian denominations in the United States, with nearly 3.3 million members in more than 8,900 worshiping communities across the 50 states and in the Caribbean region.



PASTOR

Consecrate yourselves, therefore, and be holy, for I am the LORD your God. *Leviticus 20:7*

The very first wedding I ever attended, I was a young child and my cousin was getting married. It happened in a Lutheran church on a Saturday morning somewhere in farmland Minnesota. After the wedding we all headed into the fellowship hall and had egg salad sandwiches, olives and pickles, and cake. After the cake, the bride and groom got in their car and drove away, and then so did everyone else. Simple.

In the intervening forty years, weddings have become much more complex. Basic marriage liturgies followed by a simple luncheon and cake have been replaced with a much more involved line-up of events leading up to the actual wedding, and each reception seems to be more extravagant and expensive as any I've seen before. People take out loans and max out credit cards to host their perfect wedding event.

Of course, it doesn't have to be this way. It's just what we decide to do – but we can decide to do something different.

The same is true for funerals. I've been telling families as they're planning for funerals that modest is fine, if not preferred. There is no requirement that you or your loved one needs to be buried in an ornately carved walnut casket or a marble urn. Instead of a putting on a smorgasbord for the whole community, a funeral luncheon can be bars and coffee. Simple.

Of course, I'm writing this in Lent when we make a point to live more simply, to focus less on the externals and give greater attention to what really matters. I'm also writing as a pastor who attends more funerals and weddings than the average person, and I do recognize that what is one among many for me is the only one for you. And I should say, if you want to have a big wedding reception or you feel the mahogany casket with gold and ivory in-lay will more fully express your love and honor for your family member, I am not trying to dissuade you or shame you for your choices.

But we do have choices. We don't have to do what everyone else is doing just because everyone else is doing it. We can be different.

In fact, being different was a major theme of the Old Testament. In the book of Leviticus, we see God calling the Hebrew people to be holy just as God is holy. They were to be holy, which really means to be separate or

distinct from the people around them, not just in name, but in their word and actions. What they ate or didn't eat, what kind of clothes they wore, where they worshiped, when they prayed, who they married, how they lived – almost every aspect of life – was done in such a way so that they did not do what everyone else was doing.

Jesus continues in the tradition of calling people to holiness – to living lives that are different from the world

around them so that their lives can make a difference in the world.

In the gospel he warns us against putting too much thought into what we will wear or what we will eat; he doesn't talk much about houses other than to say he doesn't have one of his own; and Jesus seems unconcerned about wedding parties or funeral arrangements. But he does call ordinary people like us to follow him into an extraordinary and unique life of loving our neighbors, forgiving and praying for our enemies, and serving others in need. These are the marks of a life of distinction, a life lived with and for the glory of God, with and for the good of our neighbors.

Confirmation


