Genesis 1:11-12 Then God said, "Let the earth put forth vegetation: plants yielding seed, and fruit trees of every kind on earth that bear fruit with the seed in it." And it was so. ¹²The earth brought forth vegetation: plants yielding seed of every kind, and trees of every kind bearing fruit with the seed in it. And God saw that it was good.

Spring has sprung for us in Northern Minnesota! Everywhere we look there are signs of new life. Flowers, plants and trees are emerging from their long winter slumber to brighten our world and invite us to ponder the beauty and majesty of God's creation. It is no wonder that this special time of year coincides with nationally and internationally recognized days of environmental awareness and appreciation. Recently, on April 22nd over 192 countries participated in Earth Day. In addition, Arbor Day is also celebrated every year on the last Friday in April. Since 1978, the month of May has been declared to be Arbor Month in Minnesota. The warmer weather in May allows newly planted trees to get off to a good start. Trees provide the world with numerous benefits. To name a few, trees help manage stormwater and keep our water clean. Trees filter the air so we can breathe easy. Trees provide food and habitat for other creatures. Trees are also beautiful and increase the quality of life for all. So, let's embrace this time of year and let's embrace our call to be good stewards of earth. Let's plant some trees.

This past year during confirmation class, our young people have been hard at work learning about God, the Biblical story, theology, and they've been learning how to live their lives as faithful people. They've learned that part of our baptismal promises include the responsibility of caring for God and the world God made. (refer to page 228 of the cranberry hymnal). Genesis 2:15 also teaches important lessons. This verse teaches us, "The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it." The Hebrew word (ah-bahd) is often translated as "till," but "serve" is actually a better translation. The implication here is that humans shouldn't just use and take from the environment, but we should serve it and act in ways that sustain its wellbeing. In this verse, God also expects the man to "keep" the garden. The Hebrew word for keep is (shamar) and can also be translated as "guard," "take care of," or "look after." Shamar indicates a loving, caring, sustaining kind of keeping. Every Sunday at the end of our worship service I say, "May the Lord bless you and keep you..." Every Sunday, we declare God's blessing to all and we call on God to keep us. In essence we are asking God to lovingly guard us, take care of us, and look after us. In turn, God asks us to do the same for God's creation.

Our young people would like to invite the wider congregation to participate in creation-care together. Church leaders have arranged to acquire some white spruce saplings which will be available after worship this month to take and plant. As an extension of this invitation, if you need physical assistance with planting the tree(s) please ask Pastor Erik and he will coordinate young people to help.


