First Lutheran Church – Hibbing is a parish of the Northeastern Minnesota Synod, one of 65 synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The ELCA is one of the largest Christian denominations in the United States, with nearly 3.3 million members in more than 8,900 worshiping communities across the 50 states and in the Caribbean region.



Pastor

I was thinking the other day about the simple act of setting out our clothes for the next day. It has become part of our family's nighttime routine. In a one bathroom house with two young kids and two adults who need to get ready for school and work in the morning, we need all the help we can get to stay organized and on time.

So, one of the things we do is we pick out the clothes we're going to wear for the next day before we go to bed. Choosing clothes seems simple enough, but sometimes making those choices can be overwhelming, especially if you're still tired or a little crabby. You know how finding that one unpaired sock at the very last minute can be the straw that breaks the camel's back. So, we eliminate those struggles, or at least we try to deal with them when we have a little more time, and do it the night before.

But putting out our clothes for tomorrow presumes that there will be a tomorrow. Or at least, a tomorrow that I'll wake up for. But the fact is, none of us knows whether we live till tomorrow or if today is our last day. Saint Teresa of Calcutta (Mother Teresa) summed it up nicely when she said: "Yesterday is gone. Tomorrow is not promised. We have only today, so let us begin."

November usually brings a sense of mortality along with it, as we begin the month with the Feast of All Saints. On that day (this year, November 5), we remember those members and friends who have died in the last year and we give thanks to God for them. We also gather a little more aware of that great cloud of witnesses described in Hebrews 12:1, the people of God throughout the ages who have died in the friendship of God – from Abraham and Sarah, the Virgin Mary and Joseph, Peter and Paul, Mary Magdalene and Phoebe, Francis and Clare of Assisi, to Katharina von Bora and Martin Luther . . . the list goes on and on.

The natural world around us reminds us as well that there is an end to all things. The lake we were swimming in a few weeks ago is freezing over, the fishing poles and kayaks stored away. The playground once full of laughing children is stiff and silent. Leaves blow away before we can bag them up, before the white pall of winter covers mother earth – sleeping, hibernating, dying.

It can all be a little depressing, and honestly it is for some of us. We'll be breaking out our Seasonal Affective Disorder lamps and taking our Vitamin D. And the reminders of friends and family who are no longer with us – especially as the two big "family" holidays (Thanksgiving and Christmas) approach – can be really difficult.

That's why it's important to remember that there is always something more happening just where we can't quite see it yet. When that lake is frozen over so thick you can drive a truck over it, remember that there are fish swimming around down there. That lonely frozen playground is just taking a much-needed break until a new batch of kids discovers its slides and monkey bars this Spring. Those family and friends we have said goodbye to - remember that one day we shall joyfully greet them again when the love of Christ, which conquers all things, destroys even death itself. I like to imagine those saints - not looking down and watching us (that idea has always bothered me) - but they're looking around heaven, enjoying each other's friendship in the presence of God, ready to greet us when our time comes to go home.

And until that time, we'll just keep laying out tomorrow's clothes the night before as a little sign of hope in a day called "today", no matter what "today" might look like. Yesterday is gone. Tomorrow is not promised. We have only today, so let us begin.

Service of Holy Communion

Join us every Sunday for worship. We gather around the means of God's grace — the Word and Sacrament — every Sunday at 9:30 am. Doors are open by 8:30 am. Volunteers and Ministers of the Liturgy

Every Sunday we gather for worship, you might notice that there are a lot of people who make it happen. Would you like to be one of them? Readers proclaim the reading and psalm. Assisting Ministers help distribute the Holy Communion. The Altar Guild sets up for and cleans up after the Communion. Ushers and Greeters welcome people into the sanctuary with a smile and a worship bulletin, and let them know when to go up for Communion. Altar Servers (usually kids, but they don't have to be) light the candles and carry the cross in and out of the sanctuary. Audio-Visual makes sure our services are broadcast on HPAT and YouTube. Fellowship Hosts make sure we all have coffee following worship. If you'd like to get involved in any of these ministries, please sign up and if you need help or encouragement, talk to the pastor.




Silent Auction

Building and Grounds Updates

Many thanks to all those who have contributed to the Building Fund. The work is ongoing! For nearly a month, Range Cornice and Roofing Company was on top of the sanctuary removing the old shingles and replacing them with a beautiful metal roof, including a new heated gutter system that will help move water away from the building. Unfortunately, over time, water has found its way into the building. There has been seeping into the basement where water wasn't draining properly from the courtyard, but recently we have had water damage to the walls and roof of the sanctuary. Hopefully the new roof will take care of all these issues from here on out!

Beginning in late October, major repairs will start in the office/ education addition. The inefficient windows, now nearly 75 years old, have been letting heat out in the winter, and in the summer they allow heat in, baking the offices and classrooms. Those windows are all being replaced. Following that major project, members of the church will be renovating the office kitchenette. The old stovetop-sink-refrigerator unit is available if anyone would like it for their cabin or hunting shack.
