
As we enter into the month of April, we come to the end of the season of Lent. We've again been sharing in a combined midweek Lenten series with Our Savior's Lutheran, and I am so encouraged every time our congregations get together to form one community in the Body of Christ. Every Wednesday evening, these past few weeks, we've come together as one Lutheran community for a soup supper and a worship service. I am very happy and grateful for those of you who have joined in this Lenten tradition as we continue to develop and deepen the relationships between our fellow ELCA congregations. If you haven't been able to make it yet, I encourage you to come to First Lutheran this Wednesday April 5 for our last 5:30 soup supper and 6:30 worship. Don't forget that these Wednesday evenings are a great opportunity for confirmands to get both a service hour and sermon note!

As it happens every liturgical year, at the conclusion of the season of Lent comes Holy Week. Palm/Passion Sunday will take place on the 9th of this month, with Maundy Thursday and Good Friday on the 13th and 14th, and Easter Sunday will come the following Sunday on the 16th. I am greatly looking forward to walking with all of you once again through Jesus' last hours, death, and resurrection in just a couple weeks. I encourage you to come not just for Easter Sunday, but the other Holy Week services as well. I truly believe the joy of Easter to be that much more powerful when we have gone through the spiritual devotion of those emotional days, the last supper and Jesus' death, and then celebrate the victory of the resurrection. It is a truly important moment in our church year and can be a very powerful experience for us as Christians. I encourage you to check out the Holy Week service times found in this news letter and to come and walk with Christ in his final steps toward the cross and his final conquering and defeat of death.

In response to this joy and freedom we have been given by God, we are called to love and serve one another and our neighbor. I hope that you feel that responsive spark within you and that calling and urging by the Holy Spirit to participate, volunteer, lead, and imagine; and serve a God who came among us, suffered and died because of us, and rose to free us from ourselves and our own selfishness. Whether you worship with us or elsewhere, I pray you have a reflective and renewing Holy Week and Easter.

We will be collecting Baby Care Kits. Bringing a baby into the world can be a difficult and scary thing for a mother living in poverty. She worries about her baby's health and well-being when there is a lack of money to buy things every mother wants for her newborn. The items included in a Baby Care Kit provide the things a mother needs to care for her baby the way she hopes to-soft blankets to give warmth and comfort, soap to keep germs away. Lack of something to dress her baby in often keeps a mother isolated from her community, but the clothes in the kit welcome both mother and baby into the world. Include the following items in each care kit:

- Two lightweight cotton t-shirts
- Two long or short sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- Two receiving blankets, medium weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn up to 52" square
- Four cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- Two pairs of socks
- One hand towel, dark color recommended
- Two bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz.) of gentle soap, in original wrapping
- Two diaper pins or large safety pins

Do not add other items or leave out items listed. Gently used, clean items (no stains or tears) can be substituted for new ones. Wrap items in one of the receiving blankets and secure with diaper pins. Do not enclose the kit or any of its contents in plastic bags. (**Drop off kits** on the counters in the Fireside Room)

Save your quarters for the ELCA World Hunger Appeal All money collected will go to the NE Minnesota Synod Assembly, and from there to help end world hunger. This year's Assembly will be held on April 28—Apri. 30 at Craguns Resort in Brainerd. Bring your quarters to the church office, or drop them in the collection plate. First Lutheran's Synod voting members attending the Assembly this year are Linda Smith and Barb Tanem.

#### **Easter Flowers—Easter Gifts**

This year we are once again asking you to contribute money to buy Easter flowers for the church. You may donate a minimum of \$7.00, and your gift may be designated to be either "in memory of" or "in honor of" someone important in your life. The cost of each plant is \$17.00, and we will order about 20. If there is money left over from buying the flowers it will go to the FLC Soup Kitchen Fund. Flowers will be purchased locally.
