#### **WELCA will be collecting School Kits Lutheran World Relief**

Education is important for any community, especially where poverty or disaster has limited options for young people to reach their potential. School Kits contain essential supplies to help children—and in some cases, adults—continue learning despite the hardships they face. And that learning leads to a better life for them, their families and their communities.

Include the following items in each school kit:

- Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide-or-college-ruled paper approx 8 X 10.5" (no loose-leaf paper)
- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with rubber band
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One 2 1/2" eraser
- One sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approximately 14" X 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks); recommended fabrics include heavy cotton, canvas, denim, and twill

Do not add other items other than those listed above. All items should be new and in good condition. Remove any excess packaging, pack all items in bag and close.

This year, Day Camp will be held at Our Savior's Lutheran Church, 501 East 23rd Street in Hibbing. This five-day-long day camp is sponsored by both Our Savior's Lutheran and First Lutheran Church. The camp counselor staff from Voyageurs Lutheran Ministry will be on hand to conduct another fun, faith-filled, awesome day camp experience. ### **2016 Synod Assembly Report—April 28-20, 2017 Breezy Point Resort—Cragun's Resort, Brainerd, MN**

Pastor Ben, Barb Tanem and Linda Smith attended the annual NE MN Synod Assembly at Cragun's Resort in Brainerd. It was interesting, educational and fun. We had good food, comfortable rooms and helpful staff. There was a worship service each day with Sunday's service featuring a mass choir—talented musicians and wonderful music—ending the weekend on a high note.

We enjoyed looking at dozens of beautiful quilts on display to be bid on. Among those was the Laurentian Conference quilt, which sold for \$300, and another made by Barb Tanem, which sold for \$160. The Market Place had a wide variety of items—many beautifully hand-crafted—also for bidding on to buy.

There were two resolutions to be voted on: 1) to take action to help end human rights abuses in Ethiopia; and 2) the Repudiation of the Doctrine of Discovery and Commitment to Partner with our Ojibwa Neighbors. Both passed.

From the many speakers we learned: 1) how the Synod is involved in several countries; 2) the various causes and programs it supports; and 3) the many ways it helps those in need.

Thanks to the congregation for sending us to the Synod Assembly. Our experience was very positive. If you haven't had a chance to attend in the past, please consider it for the future. It will definitely be worth your while.

## Faith in Action...

“BE PREPARED” – it’s the Boy Scouts’ motto, and our pantries, tornado shelters and “car trunk emergency supplies” all seem to affirm the fact that having some necessities on hand in case of an emergency is a good idea.

In relief work, we call that idea preparedness and in LWR projects around the world, preparedness is often woven into the overall project plan. For example, we work with communities to save seeds for future growing seasons, firm up river banks, build homes on safer sites, all in hopes that these precautions will help limit the impact of the next drought, flood or storm. Quilts and kits can also be part of a preparedness plan, especially when LWR pre-positions those items in a secure location close to regions particularly vulnerable to emergencies.

One way we do that is through our membership in the United Nations Humanitarian Response Depot (UNHRD) in Dubai, United Arab Emirates. Through this partnership, Quilts and Personal Care Kits have been distributed to people in Gaza who were displaced by conflict in July of 2014, and to people in Nepal whose homes were destroyed by the earthquake in April of 2015.

And our partner, Lutheran World Federation, was grateful to have Personal Care and Baby Care Kits pre-positioned in Haiti when Hurricane Matthew ripped through country, affecting more than 1.4 million people. Though the kits were stored safely and securely, the power of the storm blew the roofs off most of the buildings in the storage compound. As a result, many of the Baby Care Kits were soaked by the rain. Generous community members opened up all of the kits and meticulously washed all the baby clothing, blankets and diapers, which you can see drying in the picture above. They then reassembled the kits, and distributed them to families in Les Cayes and Aquin, some of the hardest hit areas in the country. Amazingly, our partners were still able to share the kits in the earliest days following the storm, providing comfort and basic necessities to families in critical need.

Additional quilts and kits, as well as water filtration units, were shipped to Haiti immediately following the hurricane, and LWR’s team of staff and partners on the ground will continue working with communities and the Haitian government to support recovery and rebuilding efforts in the months to come. Thanks to your gifts and the hard work of LWR’s country staff and partners, a little preparation went a long way!
