First Lutheran Church – Hibbing is a parish of the Northeastern Minnesota Synod, one of 65 synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The ELCA is one of the largest Christian denominations in the United States, with nearly 3.3 million members in more than 8,900 worshipping communities across the 50 states and in the Caribbean region.



PASTOR

I lived in Arizona for nine years — throughout high school and college, and then I returned for about a year after graduating seminary. It took me a while to acclimate to the seasons of Arizona, and I must admit I never got used to the extreme heat of Summers there. But I did grow to appreciate Springtime in the desert, especially in Tucson.

In March and April, the temperatures begin to warm up again, and the snow on the high mountains begins to melt and flows down into the otherwise dry canyons and washes. The wildflowers bloom, along with the cholla, and the mesquite trees, and by the end of April the Saguaro's big white flowers open up. The sound of birds returns to the air. And there is a smell to the desert this time of year — it has an almost Easter Sunday aroma of blooming flowers and incense and water. And all of it feels like an abundance of new life.

I've lived in Minnesota more than half my life, and I've spent more Springtimes here in Hibbing than in the desert. And this place carries distinct Easter impressions for me, as well. It's the ordered chaos of our Palm Sunday procession and watching people try to claim their usual places in the pews during "All Glory, Laud, and Honor." It's the Stripping of the Altar on Holy Thursday that leaves me speechless every year. The starkness of the bare sanctuary on Good Friday that just about breaks us open when we first see it. And of course, just a few days later, to see that same space transformed with flowers and banners and candles and people with songs of Alleluias on their lips — this, for me, is Springtime in Hibbing. And perhaps for you, this is what Easter looks and feels like, too.

All of it brings us to the good news that there is — in the Sonoran Desert and on the Iron Range, in our liturgies, in our community of faith, and in our own personal lives — there is the promise of new and abundant life. From chaos and the dark emptiness God always seems to bring us to the fullness of life in the resurrection. I am so glad we have this whole season of Easter to remind us of this truth. For the next seven weeks we will continue to hear this theme

of new life from the scripture readings in worship. Even where there has been pain, brokenness, or even death, God is still bringing us into the the joy of new life.

In this season of Easter our parish will be going through a time of transition as we bid farewell to our secretary, Rian Johnson. Rian has served as parish secretary for the past four and a half years, and we are so grateful for her work among us. She held our parish office together through the pandemic and beyond; she has brought joy to countless people in this position; and she has worked with a Call Committee, the council, countless building contractors, and three different pastors — which is no easy task — especially when you include me in that mix! Rian is a member of First Lutheran Church, so we aren't saying goodbye to her or her family — but we are wishing her all the best in her new work at the Sheriff's Office here in Hibbing. Her last day in the office is April 2, but we will have a celebration to thank her for her service here on Sunday, April 7 during Fellowship. You are invited to bring a card of appreciation for her that day.




